

Petition for Disestablishment of Paternity Checklist

1. Civil Cover Sheet for Family Law Cases, Form 12.928
2. Proof of Residency
3. Petition to Disestablish Paternity and/or Terminate Child Support Obligation, Form 12.951(a)
4. Notice and Acknowledgement of Limitation of Services Provided
5. Disclosure from Nonlawyer, Form 12.900(a) *This form is only used when a non-lawyer has assisted in the completion of the forms.*
6. Acceptance and Waiver of Service of Process of Summons **or** Return/Affidavit/Proof of Service from the sheriff's office
7. Answer to Petition to Disestablish Paternity and/or Terminate Child Support Obligation (need from respondent - if possible)
8. Designation of Current Address and E-mail Address, Form 12.915 (need two – one from each party)
9. Notice of Related Cases, Form 12.900(h)
10. Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act (UCCJEA) Affidavit, Form 12.902(d)
11. Motion to Direct the Child Support Payments not be Disbursed Pending Determination on the Petition to Disestablish Paternity and/or Terminate Child Support Obligation
12. Copy of Birth Certificate
13. Process Service Memorandum, Form 12.910(b)
14. Request for Hearing
15. Certified Statement of Final Judgment of Paternity. *This is a Florida Department of Health Vital Statistics form and will not normally need to be filed until there is a final judgment; some cases may not need this if the child's name is not being changed and/or the father is already on the birth certificate.*
